



He received his bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from the Lebanese University in Beirut, Lebanon, and a diploma of Etudes Superieures in Space Art at the ENSAD, Paris, France. He completed his D.E.A in "Art of Images and Contemporary Art," in Paris VIII in 2003. Recent exhibitions include Arabicity/Ourouba curated by Rose Issa at The Middle East Institute in Washington D.C., USA (2019); the 13th Cairo Biennial, Egypt (2019); Glasstress 2019 curated by Vik Muniz and Koen Vanmechelen at the Berengo Center for Contemporary Art and Glass in Murano, Italy (2019); Le Monde Arabe Vu Par Ses Artistes at Institut du Monde Arabe in Paris, France (2018); Scripted Reality at Lawrie Shabibi in London, UK (2018); Hommage à Marwan at Galerie Pankow in Berlin, Germany (2018); Blowback at Saleh Barakat Gallery in Beirut; Lebanon (2016); and Thin Sin: Six Artists from Beirut at Taymour Grahne Gallery in New York, USA (2014); among others. 

He currently lives and works in Zürich, Switzerland.





A seasoned cultural nomad, Noor incorporates the discoveries she makes on her world travels into her designs. Whether it be the mystical symbolism of Hindu mandalas in India, or the intricate geometric patterns found in Middle Eastern architecture, she is inspired by unexpected beauty wherever she goes.

Craftsmanship & Sustainability Noor's design process is informed by her eco-conscious lifestyle. From the ethical gold, sourced from renowned gold refineries to the diligent monitoring and tracing of precious gemstones. Noor is dedicated to producing jewelry that is ethical and sustainable. Each stone is carved by hand, and this tactile engagement is a significant element of the design process. As shown through the natural inclusions on her choice of crystals, she embraces the raw and powerful nature of gemstones. Believing that the jewelry should have a purity from start to finish when making each piece. Over the last few years, she has focused on developing innovative design techniques through layering stones, creating more dimensionality and movement throughout the crystals and gemstones.

Since launching her label in 2009, Noor has won several design awards including: Positive Luxury Awards in 2017 and 2018, and COUTURE Design Awards in 2019. Noor's collections have featured across the globe, with the likes of major stockists including Net-a-Porter, Bergdorf Goodman, Matches Fashion and more.

Princess Nourah Alfaisal is a jewelry designer who makes unique bespoke pieces. For Nuun, these unique pieces are like personal expressions of an emotion, a flash of inspiration, a snapshot of a moment in the life of the designer. In this piece she took her inspiration from the movement of heavenly bodies in the night sky finding balance and beauty in asymmetry as it is created by nature. Nuun has often been featured in Vogue, Marie Claire and Elle and her creations are loved and spotted on many universal celebrities.



It was while redesigning a pair of her mother's earrings that Princess Nourah Al Faisal, Nuun's founding designer, realized that she might have "the feel for stone". Born in Saudi Arabia, Princess Nourah Al Faisal was already familiar with the world of fine jewelry. The same intuition that enables one to read the 'energy' of a gemstone, as well as understand the harmonies of shape and colour. Studying interior design at the time, Princess Nourah Al Faisal began training as an apprentice with Parisian craftsmen, some of the best in the world. When she became an apprentice, she would walk through the Place Vendome every day at lunchtime, observing the window displays, the jewellery and their layout, refining her personal vision and her tastes. She then made her debut by designing pieces to order for her family and friends. Her circle of clients soon widened, until she opened her first boutique on rue du Faubourg Saint Honoré and created the brand Nuun in 2014. Being a palindrome, Nuun is the mirror to "Nu", which is Princess Nourah Al Faisal's nickname. It is also the written pronunciation of the letter "N" in Arabic, and thus embodies the heart of Saudi Arabia where Princess Nourah Al Faisal lives and works. It is at home, in Riyadh, that the colours, the pinks and the golds of the setting sun, the rich scents, such as omnipresent cardamom, and the geometric patterns such as those used in traditional architecture still pervade today. Singular experiences and emotions that blend with Princess Nourah Al Faisal's cosmopolitan life and inspirations and are expressed through Nuun and her designs.

Nevine Bouez's journey evolved from painting, etching, interior design and intricate freehand porcelain drawings, to her passion for hand-crafted ceramics. Her work has been featured in group exhibitions, namely the Kensington Exhibition Center of London and the Abu Dhabi Art Fair.

In the 2017 Salon d'Automne, at the Sursock museum of Modern and Contemporary Art (Beirut), Bouez won the Audience Choice Award for her two soaring ceramic creations. In 2018 the Janine Rubeiz Gallery (Beirut) presented her solo exhibition "Echoes of Earth". Nevine exhibited at the 2018 Beirut Design Fair her collection "From Mud to Gold". In the 2019 Beirut Design Fair she exhibited her ceramic "Tarboush" series. Her eclectic pieces have found homes in Cairo, Dubai, Beirut, Paris, London, Miami and New York.

Nevine has recently participated in several fundraising events. She has donated 2 works to benefit the Elisa Sednaoui Foundation, as part of the contemporary curated sale at Sotheby's London. She has also participated in LIFE "Beyond – Modern and Contemporary Lebanese Art and Design" at Phillips London by donating two large ceramic sculptures.

In 2020 Nevine participated in Sotheby's London fundraising auction for "To Beirut with Love" by donating a large ceramic sculpture. In December 2021, Nevine's work was showed in a solo exhibition at Galerie Tanit in Beirut.

Brazilian born jewellery designer Fernando Jorge encapsulates the laidback attitude and effortless sensuality of his home country, using locally sourced and hand carved gemstones, detailed by his signature finish in fluid and delicate gold structures and diamonds. The result is distinctly sculptural jewelry that is both elegant and modern.

Initially studying in São Paulo, Fernando gathered experience through key design roles in Brazil before moving to London for a Masters degree in Jewellery Design at Central Saint Martins. His graduation collection, presented in 2010, was received with critical acclaim and the designer subsequently established his eponymous brand in the UK. Over the past 10 years as a brand, Fernando has released 10 collections and counting with each having their own unique storyline that cohesively, sit together as a complete body of work. Fernando's collections are stocked globally by the most prestigious stores including Bergdorf Goodman, Le Bon Marche, and Net-A-Porter.

Having gained an international media following, the designer is widely considered to be amongst the brightest emerging talents in the jewelry world. Jorge's notable achievements include: winner of Best in Colored Gemstones (2014), Best in Diamonds (2017), and Editor's Choice (2018) at the Couture Jewelry Show, "Diamonds of the Year" from Town & Country (2018), British Fashion Awards nominations for "Best Emerging Accessories Designer" by the British Fashion Council (2014 & 2015), Business of Fashion's 500 People Shaping the Global Fashion Industry (yearly since 2014), GEM Award for "Jewelry Designer of the Year (2019), and the Town & Country Award for "Best in Diamonds" (2020).

Their creations have been worn by Liz Taylor, Tyra Banks, Madonna and many more.

TALITA is a vibrant brand with a retro soul, distilling emotions, energy, archetypal symbols and sacred geometries into powerful forms.

TALITA's contemporary creations pay homage to the Art Deco shapes, lines and culture of the 60's and 70's. The mastery of pave stone setting with daring use of colour combinations and unexpected patterns embody the wanderlust spirit of the brand.

ELIE GHARZOUZI


Elie Gharzouzi was born in Beirut, Lebanon. He studied at the American University of Beirut and Ecole Nationale Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs, Paris. At his return to Beirut in 1996, he built up his career on the local and regional fields where he got to be known and assured a reputation of talent and quality. His first office was located on the Avenue des Français in Beirut, then in Clemenceau Street in 1967.

As of 1975, Gharzouzi returns to France, where he establishes his office in the center of Paris. His international career is effectively launched since then. Creating projects in: Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Jordan, Abu Dhabi, Geneva, Madrid, London, the Cote d'Azur, Paris, Houston, Los Angeles, Washington, Montreal, and New York. He collaborated with some crowned heads and numerous renowned figures.

Back to Beirut in 1993, for the rehabilitation of Baabda Presidential Palace, he bases his office in Lebanon exclusively, and it is from Beirut that he continues until today to realize local and international projects of interior architecture and decoration.

His international career and realizations, as well as his contribution in promoting French art and products all over the world led lead him to be nominated by Mr. Nicolas Sarkozy in 2012 as a "Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur".



FADIA AHMAD (1975)

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Fadia Ahmad is a Lebanese award-winning photographer and filmmaker. Ahmad's family was exiled from Lebanon due to the ongoing Civil War and settled in Alicante, Spain where Ahmad was born. She later returned to Lebanon in 1991. She graduated from Saint Joseph University with a BA in Cinematography and Film Production where she mastered the art of photography. She is primarily known for her series of portraits and landscapes in Africa, the Middle East, and Asia. She is currently based between Beirut and Paris.

Ahmad's travels all over the world have expanded her artistic perspective and left an imprint on her work. She experienced life in several places and learned about different cultures, while also engaging in humanitarian issues. After graduating, she lived in Sub-Saharan Africa, but never stopped pursuing her artistic endeavors. She returned to Lebanon in 2002.

Her most recent project, Beyrouth/Beirut (2019), is a homage to the urban environment, complex demographics, and nostalgic architecture of Lebanon's capital. To complete this photo series, Ahmad walked a daily itinerary of 10,452 steps across the capital city. The project is a quest for identity and belonging through the streets of Beirut, in which Ahmad seeks the roots of the Self.






ALFRED BASBOUS (1924 - 2006)

Sculptor, Alfred Basbous, was born in 1924 in Rachana, Lebanon. Basbous was a central figure in the development and advancement of Modernism in the Middle East during the latter part of the twentieth century.

The artist's philosophy, grounded in simplicity, prioritised aesthetic principles of shape, movement, line and material. In the tradition of sculptors such as Jean Arp, Constantin Brâncuşi and Henry Moore, Basbous's sculptural works predominantly in bronze, wood, metal, and stone - express a lifelong appreciation of the purity of the human form, in particular the female body, and its abstract properties. In 1961, Basbous's works were included in the International Sculpture Exhibition at the Musée Rodin, in Paris. The artist pioneered the International Symposium of Sculpture in Rachana, Lebanon which took place between 1994 and 2004. During this time Basbous invited acclaimed international sculptors to visit his home village to create, sculpt and exhibit their works alongside his own, which earned Rachana the UNESCO 'Global Village of Outdoor Sculpture' title in 1997.

Basbous participated in the Alexandria Biennale in 1974. Throughout his lifetime, he was the recipient of multiple awards including the Prix de l'Orient in Beirut in 1963, Medal of the National Order of Cedar, Order of Knight: 1994 (from the Lebanese president), and the National Medal of the Order of the Cedar, Officer Order: 2004 (from the Lebanese president). When Basbous died in 2006 the President of the Lebanese Republic honoured him, posthumously, with the Medal of the Lebanese Order of Merit in Gold. The art of Alfred Basbous is part of several international public and private collections.

Ilias Lalaounis, jeweler, artist, and academician, became world renowned for creating luxurious gold jewelry steeped in history. Ilias Lalaounis was born in Athens in 1920, the third generation of a family of goldsmiths and watchmakers from Delphi. After studying economics and law at the University of Athens, he decided to join his uncle's jewelry firm, where, apprenticed as a goldsmith, he learned the skills that were to determine his future as a master craftsman.

In 1941, while Greece was in the grip of WWII, Ilias Lalaounis took over the family firm. Prompted by a passion for history, he began studying the art of his ancestors.

In the 1950's, while Greece was recovering from the war years, Lalaounis' vision became clear: he decided to breathe new life into Greek museum artifacts and transform them into jewelry by reviving age old techniques while also introducing the use of modern technology. His craft would not only be about producing an object of beauty; he would also seek to convey the spiritual and symbolic link of an object to its historical past. Lalaounis founded the Greek Jeweler's Association and exhibited his first collection in 1957, the 'archeological collection,' inspired by Classical, Hellenistic and Minoan – Mycenaean art. With modern jewels steeped in antiquity, this was anachronism at its most refined and the world took note.

Unlike his peers, who favored diamonds and large stones, Lalaounis found early on his calling in gold, 'the most human material,' as he called it. His collections, dripping in 18 and 22 karat gold, were inspired by the art of many different cultures and periods. His interest spanned from prehistoric to Minoan art, from Persian to Byzantine, from Chinese art to the art of the Tudors.

JEAN BOGHOSSIAN (1949)

Born in Aleppo in 1949, Boghossian stems from a family of jewelers for whom he worked while studying Economics and Sociology at University of Saint-Joseph in Beirut. In 1975, the Lebanese Civil War forced Boghossian to leave the country and settle in Belgium. Over three decades ago, Boghossian decided to enroll in the Academy of Fine Arts in Boitsfort, Brussels, while continuing to oversee the family business. In 1992, together with his brother and father he created the Boghossian Foundation.

Jean Boghossian is an abstract multidisciplinary artist whose recent artworks all bear, at different degrees, traces of burn degradation. It is through the process of willful damage with an invasive and rather violent method (fire), that Boghossian continuously searches for harmony. Conscious that one will never completely tame the chaotic move of flames and smoke, he enters the fire dance and moves along with the blaze until he chooses to stop the process. This is where he feels the right balance has been reached.

Globally, Boghossian is one of the few artists who experiments by applying fire and smoke to various works. Fire, being his artistic language of choice, is used through a wide array of torches. Having transitioned a little more than a decade ago towards abstraction Boghossian's art may evoke a contemporary view on the Zero-movement and Fluxus although he claims not to belong to any artistic movement.


LINA SHAMMA




MARWAN SAHMARANI (1970)

Born in Beirut, in 1970, Marwan Sahmarani's practice reflects on the increasing political turmoil and tension felt throughout his native Lebanon. He explores the cyclical patterns of violent history manifesting throughout the Middle East so that what persists in his practice is an expressive exploration of violence - of feeling, bodily motion, nature and its man-made counterpart.

The conflict between inner and outer is central but the real crux of his inquiry is simple: how two people can arrive at a point where they attempt to destroy each other. In his landscape paintings, looser brush strokes dissolve into symphonies of colour to capture the exuberance within nature.

This transition in location, from urban to rural, has transformed his work into what he identifies as more personal and more intense. What emerges from the landscape work in this context is the connection between violence and expressivity: how the brutality of nature shows a primal energy of the elements, especially when compared to its man-made counterpart. Sahmarani is the winner of the Abraaj Group Art Prize 2010 and he currently lives and works between Beirut and Spain.





Back in his native country in 1989, Molaeb started teaching art at the Lebanese University and the Lebanese American University of Beirut.


Since 1966 he has held different solo exhibitions in Lebanon, Algeria, France, Switzerland and the United States.

MAZEN RIFAI (1957)

In Mazen Rifai's small-scale paintings, thick brushstrokes traverse the horizontal axis of the canvas, often interrupted midway by more abundant planes of color ranging from pastel to night blue. A thin powdery white line, moving in parallel, marks the skyline. Rifai produces anti-illusionistic abstract works, but they are also landscapes of the Bekaa Valley. His move away from illusionism in the landscape is indebted to a modernist legacy of Lebanese painting in this genre, whose high point is often considered to be the artwork of Saliba Douaihy. Rifai's landscapes are morphologically distinct from Douaihy's, but a similar operation is at play in both, in which the move toward abstraction denaturalizes, and yet maintains, the referent.

Mazen Rifai is a Beirut-based painter and engineer. He has a degree in Fine Arts from Macerata, Italy, and a degree in interior architecture from the Lebanese University. He has also taught fine arts at the Lebanese University. Since 1974, he has participated in numerous editions of Sursock Museum's salon d'Automne. In more recent years, he has had solo exhibitions in Beirut at Galerie Rochane (2016), Galerie Aida Cherfan (2014), Gallery 6 (2010), and Agial (2007), as well as in Paris at Galerie 34 Bonaparte (2016), and Galerie Alex Menem (2009). Rifai is an art director at "Engineers, consulting & contracting", an engineering and architecture firm since 1990, and remains a consultant in the domains of construction, rehabilitation and renovation for the Council for Development and Reconstruction (CDR). In 1984, he contributed to the Beirut Central District Reconstruction Plan with Oger Liban. He is a member of the Baalbeck International Festival Committee.






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BERNARD BUFFET (1928 - 1999)

Bernard Buffet was born in Paris in 1928, spending most of his life working in France. He is known for his expressionist paintings above all, but he was also a deft producer of lithography, engraving, sculpture, book illustration, and set design. Buffet's body of work exceeds 8,000 paintings and prints. His work is held in many prestigious collections worldwide from the Vatican to Paris's Museum of Modern Art and Pompidou, New York's Museum of Modern Art, and the Tate in London. Buffet's work depicts the sheer brutality and existentialist mindset of post-war Europe. His figures are often angular and emotionless. The melancholic expressionist tone of his work has often been likened to painters Francis Gruber and Georges Rouault.

Buffet reflected the modern Parisian cultural imagination; his distinctive style and subject matter illustrate a generation trying to cope with the horrors of the world wars. His paintings are melancholy and solitary, yet they seem to communicate a unity in human emotional suffering. Although frequently viewed as heavy and foreboding, there is also a level of delicacy in Buffet's work. His style is defined by dry, angular lines that reveal buildings and bodies, which are often elongated and emaciated.


